

Thomas Rodriguez loves to take his family on their 8.5 metre pleasure boat, the DC Too. Desiree's father, Rodriguez, a 30-year-old construction worker loved the sport, especially catching seabass. A strong, slender man, he had instilled in his older daughter a love for the outdoors, teaching her how to bait a hook and cast a line.

As was their custom at least once a month, the family boarded that morning for a carefree day trip. For the first time, Thomas's sister, Corrinne Wheeler and her husband Allen Wheeler had decided to join them. They spent the day fishing in the Pacific Ocean, had barbequed fish for lunch, then left the island in the early evening. Soon, a thick fog rolled in.

Desiree was lightly asleep, when her father's sharp orders shocked her awake. "Get out of the boat. The boat is sinking!" Both the girls wore life jackets. But the adults did not. Within seconds, the boat overturned.

"You could see nothing around you. It was just dark. But it was peaceful, quiet. It was just like you see in a movie," she recalls. After some time, her father told her that he would swim for help. "Soon my mom began drifting away and I could not see her anymore after some time. Then my younger sister held on to my uncle and aunt and the current pulled them away from me." As time went on, the nine-year-old became aware that she was alone in the ocean.

Paul Strasser and Mark Pisano, two well-built 23-year-olds, who were still new to captaining boats, pushed off from San Petro at six in the morning of May 19. They had 35 passengers on board First String, a boat they had built for a fishing expedition.

These two best friends had met as 14-year-olds. Soon after, Strasser had quit his job delivering newspapers to join Pisano working on fishing boats, where they scrubbed decks of the boats that they worked on and they also cleaned the fishes that were caught. They earned the title of "pinheads"- eager young fishermen learning the ropes. They graduated to deckhands and eventually to full-fledged fishermen.

Their fishing trip that day began like any other day. Pisano remembers the fog was so thick that one could not see the stern of the boat and the fish too were not biting. They hung around for another couple of hours, but then all of a sudden a school of yellowtail, a prized game fish, started biting; and they kept pulling in fish after fish. As they worked, the weather became fine and bright.

Strasser and Pisano decided to return to San Petro with their haul and were about 11 kilometres away from CaliCali Island when Strasser noticed something white flashing in the water. He directed the First String towards it and looked through his binoculars thinking it might be a boat bumper. Passengers were yelling on the deck below. He noticed someone in the water floating wearing a life jacket, moving up and down with the waves, her brown hair visible just above the water.
