Recording of tests (for monitoring)

f you are recording your test then you must make sure the recording is clear and ready for submission beforehand. Candidate IDs and Examiner IDs must be clearly indicated in the audio sample you submit or monitoring purposes. For example 'This is John Smith as Interlocutor, Joan Smith as assessor, with Candidate A +index number) and (Candidate B index number)' etc. at the start of the recording.
