Graffiti: Art or Crime?

Have you ever seen colourfully sprayed writing or drawings on walls of buildings or when walking past a street? If you have, those ‘works of art’ you see are graffiti. To begin with, graffiti is any drawings or writing scribbled or sprayed illegally on a wall or other surface in a public area.

In some countries, spraying graffiti on walls of public places might get one arrested or fined as it is an illicit act and getting the walls cleaned would cost money. 27 Graffiti is also viewed negatively as vulgar language, making any walls with such work an eyesore to the community. Sometimes, words to protest certain issues are also sprayed, likely causing tension in the society, especially if it is a racial issue.

For individuals who draw graffiti illicitly, it is a form of self-expression. 28 Not only that, some draw graffiti as a way to release stress or vent all their pent-up emotions. Doing so does not hurt others and might even add life to a place, but some frown upon it as they find it defaces the space or property of others. 29 It could also be a way to gain attention as passers-by stop to look at the graffiti although the artists might be anonymous.

30 Although it is an offence in certain countries, there are also graffiti artists who are employed to beautify a section of walls or buildings with their works of art. Many would line the graffitied streets just to take pictures of those stunning works of art. The difference here is that being employed to spray graffiti makes it a job done with permission instead of a crime when graffiti is sprayed according to one’s whims and fancies. 31

Having said all that, it is evident that the deciding factor of whether spraying graffiti is a crime or not is the consent obtained. 32 So, be sure to do it the right way if you are interested in drawing.
