## **Marking Guidelines**

#### Part 1 - Question 1

- C1 → Mention one best thing to do before going to bed. More than 1 thing accepted.
- $C2 \rightarrow Must$  relate to C1 and explain why it is effective.

If not related  $\rightarrow$  No C2 awarded.

- $C3 \rightarrow A$  specific time is mentioned:
- Accepted: "10.00 pm" / "midnight"
- X Not accepted: "before midnight"
- $C4 \rightarrow Duration of time is mentioned.$

### Part 2 - Question 2

- $C1 \rightarrow$  Household chores 1 and 2 are mentioned. If only 1 is mentioned, consider minor omission.
- $C2 \rightarrow$  One general reason why everyone (not just teenagers) should do household chores. If the student links C2 to  $C1 \rightarrow$  Accept.
- $C3 \rightarrow Way \ 1$  and 2 to motivate teenagers to help at home. If only 1 is mentioned, consider minor omission.

Note:

If the student only talks about themselves in C3, without mentioning other teenagers, consider it minor irrelevance.

# Part 3 – Question 3 (Story)

- $C1 \rightarrow Description of the mystery, written in the tone of a story (narrative).$
- $C2 \rightarrow One$  reason why it remained unsolved, written in narrative style.
- $C3 \rightarrow$  Must use the given phrase. If extra words are added but the meaning remains unchanged  $\rightarrow$  Award C3.

# Part 3 – Question 4 (Article)

- $C1 \rightarrow Crime\ 1$  and 2 are mentioned. If only 1 is mentioned, consider minor omission.
- $C2 \rightarrow Reason 1$  and 2 must relate to C1. Not related  $\rightarrow$  No C2 awarded.
- $C3 \rightarrow Way 1$  and 2 are mentioned in relation to crime in general. If linked to C1, award C3.

## Part 3 – Question 5 (Review)

- $C1 \rightarrow Name$  of the homestay is mentioned.
- C2 → Description of the homestay (must refer to C1 only, not another homestay), written in review style and tone.
- C3 → Recommendation is given e.g., "Yes" or equivalent expressions.
- $C4 \rightarrow Reason$  related to the recommendation.

Not related → No C4 awarded.
