E - LUCAS, Language Learner

When I began learning English, I felt nervous about speaking and making mistakes. Then I tried an application where you can chat with native speakers using video and voice calls. I spoke with people from different countries every day. They were friendly and helped me feel at ease. Little by little, I got better and now, I can join discussions and give short presentations in English. I never thought I would enjoy speaking a second language, but these days I do.

F - JANE, Fitness Coach

As a fitness coach, I work with clients who feel unsure about their body image and motivation. Many become more conscious of their progress when they use fitness applications. They help track steps, exercise time, or weights lifted. When clients see their progress, they feel proud and more motivated. They stop comparing themselves to others and start focusing on their own journey. Technology helps them see results and builds real confidence.
