Suddenly, warning alarms went off through the cabin. "Elena, we're losing power in the main system," a ground control engineer reported through the crackling radio. Elena quickly examined the data on her screen. "I'm checking the backup system now," she replied calmly. "Keep sending me updates from your side." For the next few hours, she worked closely with the ground control team, testing different solutions while the storm continued to interfere with communications. The situation was stressful, but Elena remained focused.

"I've found the problem," she announced at last. "Attempting to get the system back on again now." Everyone waited anxiously. A few seconds later, the warning alarms stopped, and the power levels returned to normal.

When Aurora 1 safely returned to Earth, Elena received honours for her contribution to the mission. During an interview with the crew, Marcus jokingly said, "Without Elena, I would still be floating around in space. Thank you Elena, for showing us how to stay calm when everything seems to be going wrong." Elena laughed at the comment.
